This two-day interactive workshop is for those who teach or might teach experimental design to researchers using animals in their studies. Good tuition has been identified as one of the elements that would help improve the reproducibility of animal experiments and this workshop aims to provide tutors and potential tutors with opportunity to exchange ideas on content and presentation of courses, and to discuss teaching material available and tutors' experience with using it. It is part of a "Training the Trainers" programme and participants should be able to take away material they can use in their own teaching and indications of how various teaching approaches can be used effectively.

The workshop will be run by the FELASA Experimental Design Working Group, which is made up of tutors experienced in teaching experimental design, and will give other tutors the chance to give input to the guidance on the content of courses, on how the material is conveyed, and on assessment of outcome that the Working Group is producing. The workshop will be run as a balance between presentations and general and small group discussions, and include some material development. It will be entirely in English: participants should have good understanding of English and will need to commit to the full two days.
